Meeting Notes

Introduction for Delaware Direct Watershed Partnership, *Paul Racette, Pennsylvania Environmental Council*. Paul provided an overview of Partnership purpose and goals, and activities to date including prioritizing green streets and reviewing ecological restoration opportunities along the waterfront. Report on the City of Philadelphia's Existing and Possible Tree Canopy 2011, *Sarah Low, Philadelphia Parks and Recreation, Director of Spatial Analysis and Conservation Planning.* Sarah described the Tree Canopy assessment. This is an analysis of Philadelphia's tree canopy based on land cover data derived from high-resolution aerial imagery and LiDAR date. It found that 16,884 acres of the city were covered by tree canopy representing 20% of all land in the city. An additional 49% (42,451 acres) of the city could theoretically be modified.
