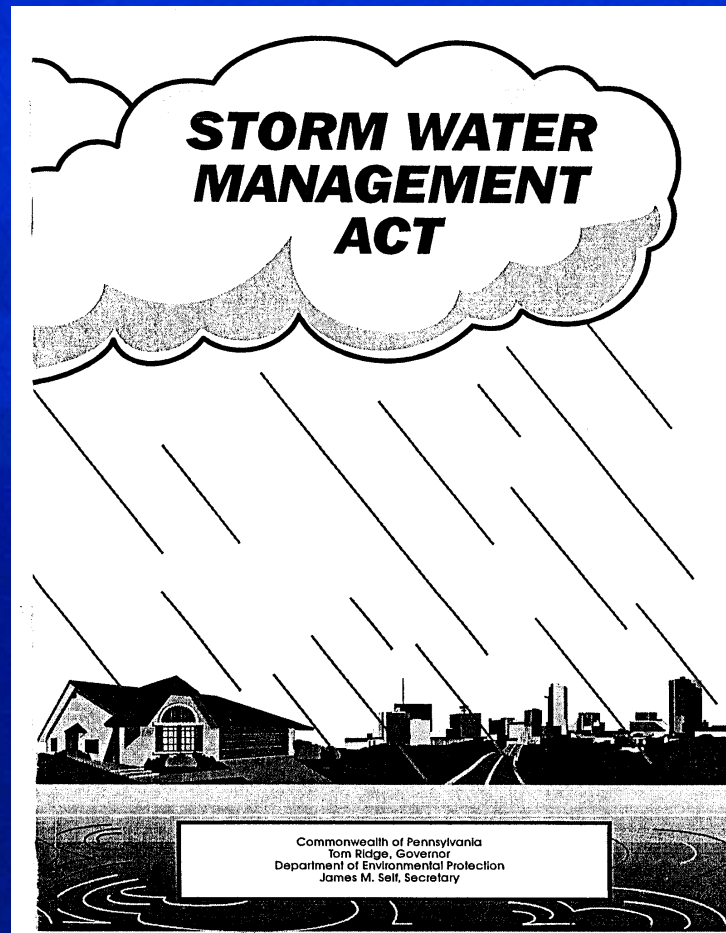
What do we do about increased rate and volume of surface runoff?



PA Stormwater Management

Act 167 of 1978

Control of Stormwater Runoff from Land Development Activities Considering Overall Watershed Management Approach Irrespective of County or Municipal Boundaries



Act 167 Purpose

- Stormwater Plans Provide Management Strategies to Municipalities To Control Quantity, Quality of Runoff, Protection of Groundwater by Infiltration, and Channel Protection



Section 6 of SWM Act – Municipal and Public Participation in Watershed Planning

“The county shall establish, in conjunction with each watershed storm water planning program, a watershed plan advisory committee...”



Watershed Plan Advisory Committee (WPAC)



- All Municipalities Located in the Watershed
- County Conservation District
- Watershed Groups
- DEP-Not an Official Representative Of WPAC, But Attendance at the Meeting Assures Accurate Plan Contents and Procedures

- DEP pays 75% of county and municipality total costs of implementing SWM plan and ordinance – keep track of costs
